

**NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING  
OF THE MIFFLIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON BEHALF OF THE LEWISTOWN BOROUGH COUNCIL  
FOR BUDGET MODIFICATIONS TO THE BOROUGH'S FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS 2016 AND 2017 COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM**

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Notice is hereby given that the Mifflin County Commissioners, on behalf of the Lewistown Borough Council will hold a public hearing on **Thursday, August 15, 2019 at 9:15AM** on the second floor, in meeting room A of the Mifflin County Courthouse, located at 20 North Wayne Street, Lewistown, PA 17044. Subsequent to the August 15, 2019, public hearing, the Mifflin County Commissioners, will consider adoption of the Resolution authorizing the County on behalf of the Borough, to submit said modification documentation to PA-DCED for approval, contingent on adoption of a Resolution by the Lewistown Borough Council. The Lewistown Borough Council will consider the adoption of a Resolution authorizing the County to submit said modification documentation to PA-DCED at their **Monday, August 12, 2019** regular meeting at 5:30PM, which will be held at the Lewistown Borough municipal building, located at 2 East Third Street, Lewistown, PA 17044.

The purpose of the public hearing is to receive citizens' views, comments and suggestions or other information from the public, for consideration by the Mifflin County Commissioners on behalf of the Lewistown Borough Council, prior to modifying the 2016 and 2017 Borough's CDBG program budgets. Additionally, citizens may also comment on the Borough's prior use of CDBG funds. Eight five (85%) percent of the 2016 and 2017 funds will be used to benefit low and moderate income persons.

The range of activities which may be undertaken with CDBG funds include but are not limited to, benefiting low-moderate income persons through various eligible activities, meeting an urgent need as identified by the community, and preventing and eliminating slum and blight.

The purpose of the modification for the 2016 budget involves the creation and funding of the South Brown Street ADA ramps project, at eight (8) locations, more fully identified within said budget modification documentation, by using remaining funds from the FFY 2016 South Wayne Street in the amount of \$8,117.96.

The purpose of the modification for the 2017 budget involves the allocation of funds in the amount \$22,810.70 from the Spring Street road reconstruction project towards the South Brown Street ADA ramps project. Funds already budgeted for the South Brown Street ADA ramps project in FFY 2017 are \$14,220.00. The total project costs for the South Brown Street ADA ramps project are \$45,148.66.

The public is encouraged to attend and participate in the hearing and meeting. Written or oral comments are encouraged and can be directed to James P. Oral comments will be accepted at (717) 242-0887 or at the hearing and meeting. Pursuant to approval by the Lewistown Borough Council and the Mifflin County Commissioners on behalf of the Lewistown Borough Council and after consideration of all comments received by the public, the Mifflin County Planning and Development Department, will submit said budget modification documentation to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (PA-DCED) for review.

The Mifflin County Courthouse and the Lewistown Borough municipal building are accessible to handicapped persons.
