REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MARCH 12, 2018 AT 5:00 PM COMMUNITY CENTER

The meeting opened at 5:00 PM with Borough Council President Larry Searer presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

ROLL CALL

Ms. Shade, Mr. Sievers, Mr. Berrier, Mr. Campbell, Mr. Wilson, and Larry Searer were present. Mr. Felmlee was absent from roll call.

HEARING OF PERSONS PRESENT

- A. Walter Vaughn of 445 Logan Street, presented Council with a sewer issue. Mr. Vaughn dug up his sewer line and noticed the Borough sewer line was clogged. Mr. Vaughn would like to submit his bill of \$545.00 for reimbursement since it was the Borough's sewer line that was clogged, not his. After talking to Mr. Welham, Mr. Vaughn was not aware that he should have contacted the Borough first. Mr. Remy advised Mr. Vaughn that any work from the lateral to the house is the owner's responsibility. Mr. Dippery confirmed that he sent the collection crew to the residence to investigate. It was first noted that Mr. Vaughn had the construction crew dig up the incorrect area. The excavator then dug up the lateral and noticed there were roots that needed to be cleaned up. Council feels it is not the Borough's responsibility for work that was advised by a contractor and done by the homeowner.
- B. John Pannizzo of Lewistown, spoke on behalf of the Mifflin County Youth Baseball, reminded Council that he presented to Council last year the plan to put lights up at Lewistown Rec Park for the kids. Mr. Pannizzo mentioned that the installments of the lights were a part of the county and borough plans for enhancing and improving the parks within the community. Mr. Pannizzo indicated that MC Youth Baseball is a 501(c)(3) identity and has filed for a sales tax exempt status with the Department of Revenue; however, this process takes 6 8 weeks. The cost of the lights is approximately \$60,000 and that has been paid through fundraisers, donations and grants. The sales tax is \$3600. Mr. Pannizzo asked Council to consider being a co-partner with MC Youth Baseball since the lights are being placed on Borough property. A form would be filled out showing that Lewistown Borough would be a co-partner and both names would appear on the invoice, allowing the MC Youth Baseball to be sales tax exempt.

Due to Borough code, Mr. Remy, Borough Solicitor, indicated the only way the Borough could do it would be to have the Borough bid it out. Mr. Pannizzo indicated it was already procured and they received a grant for it. Mr. Remy said he could do more research if Council wished.

Mr. Berrier informed Mr. Pannizzo that there is a procedure for him to follow if the MC Youth Baseball is approved for sales tax exemption that is retroactive and they would not owe the sales tax.

Council then went on to explain that if they were to sign on as a purchaser, there would be certain procedures outlined by the state they would have to follow that would hinder the request.

More discussion ensued and at this time, due to Borough code and Mr. Remy's recommendation, no action was taken.

A. Treasurer

- 1. On a motion by Ms. Shade and seconded by Mr. Sievers, Council by unanimous vote, approved to bid out the Materials, Equipment and Goods Manual.
- 2. Ms. Walter received a letter from the Board of Assessment Appeals of Mifflin County stating that the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs indicated that Joyce Virginia Cutler at 12 West Hale Street is completely disabled from military duties and is in financial distress. They are asking for an exoneration of taxes in the amount of \$527.97.

B. Code Enforcement Officer

1. Mr. Fink reported there were 37 violations in February. He stated 17 of those violations were snow tickets, totaling \$425 and \$375 has been collected. There were 17 permits issued for \$3,459.33 in zoning fees. There was \$150.00 collected in sidewalk permits. Improvements totaled \$468,911 in February with a year-to-date of \$1,402,944. The inspection fee for February was \$75, totaling \$380 for the year. There was also one LOMA letter issued last month.

Mr. Felmlee arrived at the meeting at 5:38 pm.

C. Fire Chief

 Chief Barlett reported that for the month of February, the fire departments had 14 alarms plus medical assists. With assistance, Fame sponsored two days of training during Super Bowl week. MCI class was held at the Mifflin County High School, hosting 171 people.

D. Mayor

- 1. Mayor Bargo informed Council that EM management plan is being updated and is expected to be completed within the next two weeks.
- 2. Local wrestlers participated in a parade honoring them for their hard work.

E. Police Chief

1. Chief Clemens stated that in the month of February, the Lewistown Police had 218 calls to service, 34 citations issued for traffic, 23 citations issued for non-traffic. Total of fines issued was \$5,619.

F. Board of Recreation

On a motion by Ms. Shade and seconded by Mr. Searer, Council by 6-1 (Searer) vote, approved the use of the Community Center with alcohol for Tonya Searer pending receipt of updated Certificate of Liability Insurance.

G. Borough Solicitor

1. Mr. Remy is seeking to adopt the CDBG 2016 agreement and subsequent year's ordinance with the County at 15%. In the past it has been done on a year to year basis. If Council wants to change it in the future, it can be reviewed and negotiated as long as both parties agree.

Ms. Shade was questioning the difference between the 15% and the cost of the fees to readvertise and amend the ordinance.

At this time, Council only wished to adopt the 2016 CDBG agreement.

2. Mr. Remy discussed the late fees for failing to pay fines on violations with regards to removing grass, brush, or weeds. The Ordinance stated 2% and Law and Ordinance Committee recommends that the fees increase from 2% to 10%.

On a motion by Ms. Shade and seconded by Mr. Berrier, Council by unanimous vote, approved to increase fees and adopt the Ordinance with the change to 10%.

Discussion was held on the parking tickets. Changes include the sweeper tickets from \$15 - \$20 and meter parking from \$5 - \$10. This will be forwarded to the Law and Ordinance for further review.

H. Borough Manager/Secretary

- 1. Mr. Welham attended the Lewistown Fireman's Relief Association quarterly meeting. A report was handed out to each council member. As of the end of 2016, they had \$309,853 in assets and \$118,480 in liability. Their total net assets available are \$191,373. There was a question at the last meeting as to why the borough is funding the turnout gear and it shows on the report that the investment income is barely covering the interest expense. As more information becomes available for 2017, Mr. Welham will advise Council.
- 2. Mr. Welham presented Council with MCSB parking spaces that were approved for lease in November 2017 which are located behind Sacred Heart office. Complaints and concerns were addressed by Sacred Heart and MCSB agreed to decrease parking from eight spaces at \$125 per space to two spaces at \$150 per space.

On a motion by Ms. Shade and seconded by Mr. Wilson, Council by unanimous vote, approved the decrease of eight parking spaces to two parking spaces for MCSB with a cost of \$150 per space.
